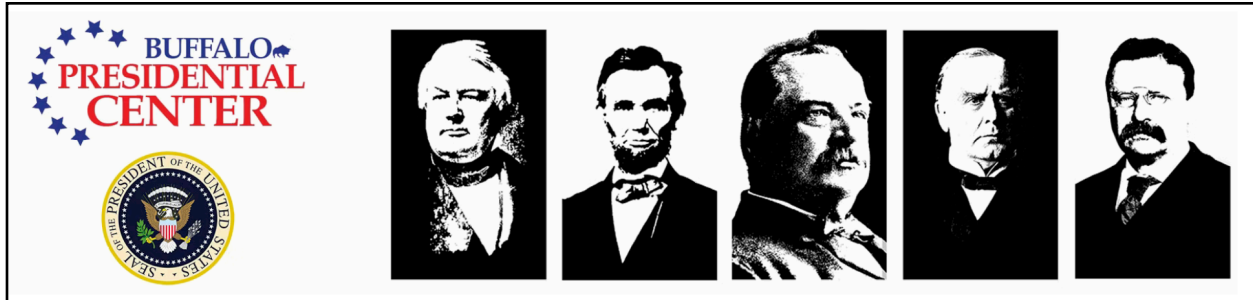




Call for Student Presenters

The Buffalo Presidential Center is seeking elementary, middle, and high school-age students to create and deliver an 8-12 minute public presentation at our museum in the Central Library on a topic of their choice, related to American history and the presidency.

Participants would be part of our upcoming **3 x 5: A Presidential History Program**, in which *three* speakers — a presidential historian, a high school student, and an elementary or middle schooler — will deliver different educational programs, spanning *five* months. Each student would be responsible for one topic and a single presentation.

One of our adult scholars will work with students, as needed, to develop their topic and prepare to present before an audience. This is an exciting opportunity (and resume builder!) for any student who loves history.

There is no cost to participate. Each program will take place at 11 a.m. on a Saturday during the 2026-27 school year at the Buffalo Presidential Center, on the second floor of the Central Library. Dates are October 3, November 21, January 23, February 27, and March 20.
